RE: Emergency Waiver of Standards at Benton Crossing Landfill (26-AA-0004)

Dear Mr. Dublino:

Mono County Environmental Health Department, acting as the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA), has reviewed your request for an Emergency Waiver of Standards at Benton Crossing Landfill in order to accept greater than the permit limit of 500 tons per day of material to accommodate the disposal, recycling, or beneficial reuse of clean soil, concrete, metals, and other inert materials generated by the Round Fire debris removal program. Per 14 CCR §17210.8, we hereby grant a waiver of standards at the Benton Crossing Landfill as noted above and as described in your request dated April 13, 2015, for a period not to exceed 120 days from the date of this letter and subject to the following conditions:

1. All other state minimum standards and permit conditions which are not subject to the waiver shall remain in effect.
2. The effective period of this waiver, once granted by the LEA, shall not exceed 120 days. If necessary, the LEA may extend the effective period of a waiver, upon receipt of the reports described in 14 CCR §17210.5.
3. You must comply with the reporting requirements as described in 14 CCR §17210.5, Reporting Requirements for a Solid Waste Facility Operator.
4. This waiver may be modified, canceled, or revoked by the LEA without advance notice should the LEA determine that any of the following occurs:
 - a) The use of such a waiver will cause or contribute to a public health and safety or environmental problem;
 - b) The terms of the waiver are not being used expressly to handle the state of emergency or local emergency and are not in the best interest of the public health and safety;
 - c) The waiver is no longer necessary;
 - d) The solid waste facility operator is not utilizing disaster debris diversion programs to the extent feasible.

This waiver will be reviewed by, and is subject to the approval of, the California Department of Resources, Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle). CalRecycle may condition, limit, suspend, or terminate the use of this waiver.
