Regulatory Authority

The County of Sacramento Environmental Management Department (EMD), as the Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) for the California Integrated Waste Management Board (CIWMB), is authorized by Division 30 Public Resources Code (PRC) Sections 43209, and Title 14 of the California Code of Regulations (14 CCR) Sections 18051 and 18084, to implement the solid waste regulatory program in Sacramento County. Pursuant to PRC Sections 45000, 45005, and 45011, the LEA is further authorized to order solid waste facility owners and/or operators who are in violation of the aforementioned statutes, regulations or any corrective action or cease and desist order, and/or whose facility or operation poses a potential or actual threat to public health and safety or the environment, to cease and desist any improper action, to correct the violations, and/or to abate the threat, according to a time schedule established by the enforcement agency.

Background

The Dixon Pit Landfill is a closed landfill located at 8973 Elk Grove-Florin Road, APN 127-0010-062-000. Super Pallet Recycling Corporation owned the Dixon Pit Landfill until June 2006 when it was sold to Five Star Auto and Towing, Inc. The landfill was certified as closed on July 2, 2007. Super Pallet Recycling Corporation is designated as the operator of Dixon Pit Landfill on the facility's Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP) #34-AA-0007, issued on July 2, 2007, and Five Star Auto and Towing, Inc. is designated as the owner. Super Pallet Recycling Corporation will remain the facility operator unless a new facility operator establishes financial assurances through the CIWMB. Therefore, the LEA issues this Notice and Order (Order) to both **the operator of record, SUPER PALLET RECYCLING CORPORATION and the facility owner, FIVE STAR AUTO AND TOWING, INC. (Respondent).**

The facility has a history of violations including failure to maintain the gas control system to prevent the methane gas concentration detected at perimeter monitoring probes from exceeding the regulatory limit of 5% methane by volume in air.

The Respondent declined a September 13, 2007, meeting request by the LEA to discuss methane gas exceedances and instead submitted a letter dated September 18, 2007, that included the "Operator's Plan to Address Methane Concentrations in Subsurface Probe LFG 10-2". This plan described modifications to the gas collection pipe system and the construction of new infill gas extraction wells.

**Background,
continued**

In a letter dated October 25, 2007, the Respondent proposed additional measures to abate the gas violation at probe 10-2 including leveling and alignment of the gas collection pipe system and further stated that "if compliance is still not achieved by all these efforts, then we will move on to the installation of the additional infill extraction wells as has been recommended by our engineer".

On December 28, 2007, the Respondent submitted plans for the installation of the two proposed gas extraction wells to the LEA, CIWMB and the Regional Water Quality Control Board (RWQCB). The plans were approved by the LEA on January 3, 2008 and the RWQCB on January 7, 2008, respectively. CIWMB approved the plans on February 7, 2008.

As of this date, the Respondent has not installed the approved infill gas extraction wells despite the fact that gas probe 10-2 has been found to have methane gas concentrations in excess of the regulatory limit of 5% methane by volume in air for the months of May, June, July, August and September 2008.

Pursuant to the Respondent's Landfill Gas Monitoring Plan (LGMP) in the facility's Post Closure Maintenance Plan, the Respondent is required to increase gas monitoring frequency to weekly if any gas probe concentration is detected at greater than 5% methane by volume in air.

**Methane, Gas
Control and
Monitoring History**

May 8, 2008, inspection: Violation 27CCR 20921 (Gas Monitoring and Control) and 27CCR 20937 (Reporting and Control of Excessive Gas Concentrations)

- Gas monitoring by LEA staff of probe 10-2 indicated 5.5% methane by volume in air.

May 14, 2008, inspection

- LEA and CIWMB staff and Mr. Emslander, Five Star Auto and Towing staff, performed gas monitoring of probe 10-2. The monitoring results obtained by LEA and CIWMB staff were consistent with the results obtained by Mr. Emslander. All three parties used their own, separate, GEM 2000 gas meters and all readings were below 5 % methane by volume in air.

Methane, Gas Control and Monitoring History, continued

- However, LEA and CIWMB staff questioned the reliability of the data since Mr. Emslander had conducted gas monitoring of probe 10-2 approximately two hours earlier. His monitoring results indicated 5% methane by volume in air.

June 19, 2008, inspection: Violation 27CCR 20921(Gas Monitoring and Control) and 27CCR 20937 (Reporting and Control of Excessive Gas Concentrations)

- Gas monitoring by LEA staff of probe 10-2, in the presence of Mr. Emslander, indicated **5.8%** methane by volume in air.

July 14, 2008, inspection: Violation 27CCR 20921(Gas Monitoring and Control) and 27CCR 20937 (Reporting and Control of Excessive Gas Concentrations)

- Gas monitoring performed by LEA staff of probe 10-2, in the presence of Mr. Emslander, indicated **6.6%** methane by volume in air.

August 25, 2008, inspection: Violation 27CCR 20921 (Gas Monitoring and Controls) and 27CCR 20937 (Reporting and Control of Excessive Gas Concentrations)

- Gas monitoring performed by LEA staff of probe 10-2, in the presence of CIWMB staff, indicated **6.5%** methane by volume in air.

In addition, the following weekly gas monitoring data for probe 10-2 was submitted by the Respondent for July, August, and September 2008: (all values are % methane by volume in air; those values exceeding the regulatory limit are in **boldprint**)

Additional required actions

Because gas monitoring of gas probe 10-2 on June 19, 2008, was performed with a GasTech model GT Land Surveyor 105, which is designated as the backup instrument in the facility's Landfill Gas Monitoring Plan (LGMP), and because the Respondent has repeatedly failed to control landfill gas at the property boundary, the Respondent shall take the additional actions specified in the table below:

Additional Actions to be Taken	Compliance Date
<p>1.0 If the Gem 2000 needs repair or service, the following actions are required:</p> <p>1.1 The LEA must be notified immediately by telephone or fax on the day the Gem 2000 is sent in for service.</p> <p>1.2 Receipts documenting repair or calibration dates and type of service must be sent to the LEA within one (1) week of repair if the Gem 2000 is out of service for any reason.</p> <p>1.3 The backup instrument, GasTech model GT Land Surveyor 105, may be used ONLY as a backup in the event that the GEM 2000 is being serviced or repaired and may NOT be used for weekly gas monitoring for more than two (2) consecutive weeks during any period of use.</p> <p>1.4 The Respondent must make alternate arrangements to continuously monitor perimeter probes if the primary meter is out of service for longer than two (2) weeks. This can be accomplished by renting a GEM 2000 or comparable gas meter or by hiring a qualified contractor to conduct gas monitoring using comparable equipment.</p> <p>1.5 Oxygen and carbon dioxide readings must be submitted to the LEA along with weekly methane monitoring data when using the GT Land Surveyor 105.</p>	<p>1.0 through 1.5 All actions are required effective immediately.</p>

<p>2. The Respondent shall continue to monitor gas probe 10-2 weekly until approval has been received in writing from the LEA to reduce monitoring frequency, based upon the LEA's determination that gas control has been achieved and is considered reliable.</p>	<p>2. Continuously and immediately.</p>
<p>2.1 Amend the LGMP to state that, when required to increase the monitoring frequency to weekly, the operator will submit the monitoring data to the LEA by either general mail or electronically within five (5) days of the monitoring event.</p>	<p>2.1 Within five days of receipt of this Order.</p>
<p>2.2 Submit a draft copy of the changes to LGMP to the LEA.</p>	<p>2.2 Within 30 days of receipt of this Order.</p>
<p>2.3 Submit a final copy to the LEA of changes to the LGMP after LGMP changes have been approved by the LEA.</p>	<p>2.3 Within 30 days of written approval by the LEA.</p>

Terms and Conditions

Each and every required action specified in the above Compliance table shall be complied with on or before the dates specified.

The Respondent will be charged the expense of any additional time spent by LEA staff in relation to this enforcement action.

If violation of the compliance table item, the PRC, and/or the CCR is noted, the period of such additional inspections and monitoring shall be extended. The Respondent shall fully cooperate with all inspections.

Penalties

Failure to comply by the applicable deadlines in this Notice and Order may result in enforcement action.

Pursuant to PRC 45011, penalties up to \$5,000.00 per day may be imposed by the LEA by written notification to the owner or operator or both for failure to achieve compliance by the deadlines established by the LEA in this Notice and Order.

Penalties, *continued*

Failure to comply by the applicable deadlines may result in the LEA contracting for corrective action at the expense of the owner, operator or both, which may be recovered pursuant to PRC section 45000.

Failure to comply by the applicable deadlines may result in the LEA petitioning the superior court to enjoin the violations, and continued violation after the granting of an injunction may be punishable as contempt of court.

Right to Appeal

You may appeal the stated violations by completing the following:


1. Submit a completed Notice of Defense (Attachment 1) along with the written statement providing the reason(s) why you should not be subject to the enforcement action postmarked within 15 days of receipt of this notice.
2. Be available to participate in an appeal hearing before the Hearing Officer.

Please be advised that you may be liable for all or a portion of the costs of the Appeal Hearing.


