Please be advised that the County of San Diego Department of Environmental Health, Solid Waste Local Enforcement Agency (LEA) will be holding an informational public meeting in compliance with Public Resources Code §44004(h) regarding proposed permit revisions to the Solid Waste Facility Permits, SWIS #37-AA-0903 and #37-AA-0902, for the Las Pulgas and San Onofre Landfills. These landfills are restricted to receiving only base-generated municipal solid wastes. The LEA is certified by the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle), formally known as the California Integrated Waste Management Board, to enforce state laws and regulations at solid waste disposal sites on Camp Pendleton.

Las Pulgas Landfill

The Las Pulgas Landfill is an existing landfill with a disposal area of 88.7 acres located in Area 43, Basilone Rd, Camp Pendleton, California. On December 21, 2009, the LEA accepted for review a Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP) application package from the United State Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton requesting an increase of 130 tons per day in the maximum daily tonnage of municipal solid waste.

The proposed revisions to Las Pulgas Landfill SWFP# 37-AA-0903 would:

- Increase the maximum daily tonnage of municipal solid waste from 270 tons per day to 400 tons per day;
- Increase the maximum daily traffic volume from 37 to 80 vehicles per day;

- Allow the use of processed green materials as an alternative daily cover;
- Define landfill property boundary;
- Provides design updates for the Phase II liner system; and
- Update current design documents, capacity calculations, estimated closure date and LEA findings.

The LEA's preliminary determination is that the proposed permit revision be approved. The proposed revision to the SWFP would NOT allow for a change in days or hours of operation, or expansion of the landfill disposal footprint.

San Onofre Landfill

The San Onofre is an existing landfill with a disposal area of 28.6 acres located in Area 52, Basilone Rd, Camp Pendleton, California. On February 5, 2010 the LEA accepted for review a Solid Waste Facility Permit (SWFP) application package from the United State Marine Corps Base Camp Pendleton requesting an increase of 50 tons per day in the maximum daily tonnage of municipal solid waste.

The proposed revisions to San Onofre Landfill SWFP#37-AA-0902 would:

- Increase the maximum daily tonnage of municipal solid waste from 50 tons per day to 100 tons per day;
- Increase the maximum daily traffic volume from 35 to 50 vehicles per day;
- Allow the use of processed green materials and geosynthetic blankets as alternative daily covers;
- Define landfill property boundary; and
- Update, capacity calculations, estimated closure date and LEA findings.

The LEA's preliminary determination is that the proposed permit revision be approved. The proposed revision to the SWFP would NOT allow for a change in days or hours of operation, or expansion of the landfill disposal footprint.

This Public Meeting is for any interested parties to learn more about the proposed SWFP revisions and to provide comments to the LEA regarding the proposed actions. The decision to approve or deny the SWFP revisions will be made by the LEA within 120 days of the date the application was deemed complete as required by State statute, and will be submitted to the California Department of Resources Recycling and Recovery (CalRecycle) for concurrence.
